Our Stories, Quilting, Quilters, Why We Quilt and More

My mother is the reason I joined Capital Quilters Guild in September 2009. My mother, Jean, had always sewed clothes and gifts. As her retirement neared, she decided she needed a hobby and she joined a quilting guild in New Jersey. My parents, in retirement, moved to eastern Pennsylvania, and she joined the guild there. In early 2010, they decided to place the property in PA up for sale and move to NC to be closer to me and out of the long, cold winters. I knew she needed a quilt guild to join, so I found one for both of us. She died unexpectedly in October 2009, never moving to NC, and never attending a meeting with me.

I have also always sewed clothes and gifts. I took a sewing machine with me to college. My two, then three, daughters and I always had matching dresses for Easter and Christmas. I started very early making baby blankets, not knowing that the three layers formed a quilt. As my mother learned about quilting, she often gave suggestions to improve my baby blankets and supplied patterns from her quilt guild for me to use. Then I met a member of CQG and she brought me more patterns for baby quilts. When my mother wanted to move to the Raleigh area, I knew of CQG and joined. I remain appreciative of her prompting that lead me to this wonderful, friendly, and inspiring group of quilters. Please find in the photos below her gift to me of the Carolina Lily wall hanging, inspired by my family's home in North Carolina.



President's Challenge!

The challenge is to take 1 or 2 pieces of fabric pictured, which is cut in 2.5 and 4.5 strips WOF. You must use a full strip of fabric in the quilt. It can be cut into any shape or form that you want just so you use the whole strip. There is no changing of the color. The quilt must be at least 36 in sq. or bigger. It must be finished including the binding.

You have until the June meeting to finish. Happy Quilting!



2020 Quilt Show Update

Another month has gone by that we aren't able to get together. I was hoping that I would be standing in front of you in April reporting on how exceptional the quilt show was but that was not to be. I think I speak for the Committee that we are very disappointed we were not able to bring it across the finish line for the Guild. Several 2020 Quilt Show committee members were new to volunteering and were very excited to be of service to you. But, there will be other quilt shows and their talents and expertise will be needed once again.

Thank You

I cannot adequately express how thankful I am for all of the hard work the 2020 Quilt Show Committee and the 2021 Shadow Committee Chairpeople did to pull off a fantastic show. I want to thank the Board for their support and guidance over the last 2 years and their confidence in me and the Committee. Mostly I want to express my appreciate to all of the guild members who submitted quilts for display, volunteered their time and expertise, participated in the challenge quilt program, made animal quilts for our charity partner and made boutique items to sell at the show to increase our revenue for this year's show. You did it. 🙌 You registered 276 quilts this year – many first time submitters – and we now know just how many quilts the Scott Kerr Building will hold for our quilt show. Yay!! We also had a larger number of non-guild member submitters and many of those signed on as new members. Great news!! You donated a record number of silent auction quilts. Several new vendors to our show signed up this year and were very excited. You should all be very proud of your efforts.

Committee Reports

Finance – I know that we are all concerned about the expenses that we cannot recoup from this year's quilt show. The good news is that the events of this year are truly global so we were not in this alone. Our service providers have been more than generous in their understanding and willingness to work with us. The deposits for the NC Fairgrounds and NC Convention Services have both agreed to use those deposits towards the 2021 show. The judges agreed that their contract was void due to the Governor's cancelling all events at the

fairground so no payment is due on their contracts. The expenses for advertising, show badges, flyers and miscellaneous copy fees totaling \$1,491.97 cannot be recouped (this total includes \$299.72 spent for the banner which can be used each year going forward). All vendors fees have been returned to the vendors except for Threadwaggle/APQS who donated the \$630.00 fee to the Guild to offset the unrecoupable expenses. We thank her for her donation. So, the total expenses on this year's quilt show is \$562.25.

Special Exhibits and Boutique. There were 9 Challenge Quilts submitted. At an upcoming meeting, these quilts will be displayed and the membership can vote on the quilts at that time. We will be sure that the members know when that will occur so that anyone who wishes to vote can be sure to attend. There were 51 silent auction quilts submitted to benefit the Wake County SPCA. We have offered these to Wake Country SPCA (and they have accepted) to use in one of their fundraisers this year. Unfortunately, like many events, most of their fundraising has been cancelled. If they are not able to auction these quilts off this year, we will hold them for the 2021 Quilt Show. Boutique items. There were approximately 200 items submitted for the Boutique as of March 12th. There were will many guild members that were going to drop them off at the Convention Center during show set up so there is really no way of knowing exactly how many more items we would have received. These items will be carried over to the 2021 Quilt Show. The four door prizes (two gift baskets and two quilt kits) will also be held over to the 2021 Quilt Show.

Quilt Intake and Return. As I mentioned earlier we had 276 quilts registered and 269 turned in. Of those 269, 30 were entered as non-judged. If you thought the quilt intake process was a huge undertaking, the return of the quilts after the show was canceled was no less daunting. Huge thanks to Ginny Esch, Cheryl Porter, Nancy Honeycutt and Diana Jones for the quick response to the quilt return/pick-up process. All but 2 of the quilts were picked up within one week of the show. That is a tremendous effort by everyone involved. I know we won't see all of these quilts in the next show because many of you had to get them back from the recipient of your most generous work or they have since been gifted to friends and family.

I want to thank Nancy Honeycutt and her husband for the enormous effort put into the virtual quilt show. I hope we get to see many of these quilts in person next year. Below is a listing by category of the quilts submitted.

40-- 100, Individual, Pieced, Longarm Quilted
48 -- 200, Individual, Pieced, Stationary Machine Quilted
6 -- 300, Individual, Mixed/Other techniques, Longarm Quilted
13 -- 400, Individual, Mixed/Other techniques, Stationary Machine Quilted
9 -- 500, Individual, Hand Quilted, Any Technique
76 -- 600, Duet, made by 2 persons, all techniques
22 - 700, Group, made by 3 or more persons, all techniques
13 -- 800, Modern
12 -- 900, Miniature (no side larger than 30" on any side and small in scale)
12 -- P Pictorial
15 -- 1000 A, Art
3 -- 1100, Wearable Art and Accessories

Volunteers – Once again you offered your time to make the show a success. We filled around 90% of the volunteer slots by the time the show was canceled. There were many of you who were willing to work in any slot we needed. Thank you for your service. Thanks to Lauri McCormick for using an online sign up tool for the volunteers this year. I can expect you will see it being used again next year.

Ribbons – A big thank you to Roberta Miller-Haraway for creating the beautiful ribbons for the show winners this year. We are hoping we will be able to use part of these ribbons for the next show.
