#### Hi Capital Quilters!



## Quilts in Bloom or

#### **Art in Quilts**

The Capital Quilter's Guild quilt show is the same weekend as the NC Museum of Art's annual Art in Bloom. If you have never been, it is a fundraiser where they have florists create arrangements inspired by a piece of art in the museum. The flower arrangement is displayed with the inspiration piece.

For the President's Challenge, members can approach their design(s) in one of two different ways:

- 1. **Quilt in Bloom** a quilt inspired by flowers/gardens
- Or...

2. **Art in Quilt** - a quilt inspired by a piece of artwork (a copy of the inspiration piece should be hung with the quilt).

The quilts should be 96" or smaller in perimeter and should be bound with black or gold fabric provided by the Guild. The quilt will be hung at the show and should have a sleeve on the back.

## February 2024 Workshops

#### Catherine Redford

Catherine is a frequent magazine contributor and has enjoyed being a guest on Quilting Arts TV. She is enjoying the resurgence of interest in handwork with an embroidery book, Butterfly Stitches, published Fall 2020. With two DVDs and a book on Modern Machine Quilting techniques, Catherine delights in finishing her own quilts on a domestic machine. Catherine is also a Bernina Ambassador.





## Friday February 16, 2024 Walking Foot Quilting-Beyond the Ditch

For quilters who have tried some walking foot sewing, this class will expand your skills. Learn how to finish your quilts on a domestic machine while enjoying all the control of your walking foot. We will start with a brief discussion of preparing your tops for quilting including marking and basting-then we will make stitched samples of different styles (as seen on Quilt Art TV).

## Saturday February 17, 2024 Beginning English Paper Piecing

Learn the honored technique of English Paper Piecing using precut card templates. Stitch a simple flower and appliqué it to a background ready for a small pillow or mug rug. You will be introduced to some traditional and more innovative quilts to inspire your next project. Use hexagon paper to draw out your design and be ready with an ideal portable activity (as seen on Quilting Arts TV).

### One Quilter's Experience

I do not hold myself out as an expert. I know that many of you know so much more than I do. I share my experience in the hope of helping newer quilters as well as to stimulate conversation among more experienced quilters. I welcome feedback and differing views, as we are all on this journey together and can only benefit from hearing each other. (If you are reading this in the newsletter, please weigh in on Facebook.)

#### **Quilt-worthy/Not quilt-worthy**

If you have <u>ever</u> given away quilts to family or friends, I hope you have had nothing but positive responses to your generous gifts. However I am sure that all of us have either experienced, or have at least heard stories of, negative

responses. Very little is more frustrating to a quilter than to know that all of their hard work and time went toward someone who does not appreciate it.

Are they

Quilt

Worthy?

To be fair, tastes vary and it is not reasonable to expect that what we think is beautiful will be universally appreciated. I would never purchase a work of art or decorative household item for someone else and yet, I do make quilts for others. (And, yes, I do see the inconsistency!) Even if an item might be appreciated in the abstract, it might not suit the space it would be put into – too modern; too traditional; wrong colors; wrong size or shape; wrong vibe.

Yet, as quilters, gifting a quilt is how we show how much we value others. "I love you enough to spend not just a considerable amount of money, but more importantly my time, effort, and long-honed skills to make something special just for you." The last response we want is, "I will throw this in the back of a dark, dank storage area and forget it exists."

I have had conversations and have seen social media threads discussing the concept of quilt-worthiness. Opinions range considerably. There are those who can make quilts for others and be blithely unconcerned about whether they are appreciated by the recipients. Or so they claim. (I can't help but be a bit skeptical of this.) There are those who never make quilts for others, either because they have had one or more bad experiences or have been frightened off by stories of the bad experiences of others. There are those who only make quilts for those whom they are confident will appreciate them. There are those who will make just about anyone in their orbit a quilt, but, once someone has proven themselves to be not quilt-worthy, will not make them a quilt again.

This last is my own approach. I think a gift, once given, ought not to be the concern of the giver. If the recipient uses the quilt given them to catch drips when changing the oil in their car, so be it. It makes me feel a bit ill and it makes me grind my teeth, but the quilt is their own to use or to abuse. That being said, a quilter certainly has every right to take that knowledge and use it to determine whether this person is worthy of any further investment of quilting time and effort. If this is someone with whom you have an ongoing mutual gift-giving relationship, do what non-quilters do – go buy them something. Once someone has shown themselves to be not quilt-worthy, that does <u>not</u> mean I do not think them a good person. It does <u>not</u> mean I do not care about them. It <u>does</u> mean I will not make them a(nother) quilt. They have, by their actions, proven themselves to be not quilt-worthy.
